Quilted in Clay Announces Christmas 2005 Ornament and Jewelry Line Based on the Popular “Lone Star” Quilt Block Design

Alvarado, Minnesota — October 1, 2005 — Quilted in Clay announced today the Christmas 2005 design for their annual, time-limited collection of holiday ornaments and jewelry. Based on the Lone Star, one of the oldest and most recognizable quilt block patterns, this year’s original design displays the star shining upon a manger.

The Lone Star quilt pattern is a large central star, made up of diamond shapes to form the star points from the center out. Often the colors are chosen and placed to form what appear to be concentric circles radiating around the center.

“The Lone Star quilt block has many variations and is known by many names. I began by using the eight-point design and then replaced two of the points on a single side of the star with an image of a manger,” said Jennifer Patterson, Artist and Owner, Quilted in Clay. “This new pattern on an ornament and jewelry now becomes a unique holiday keepsake that is signed and dated.”

Each Lone Star Christmas 2005 Ornament is one-and-one-half inches square in size, and hangs to 4 inches on a handmade wire hook. It’s signed and dated on the back, and will arrive individually packaged in a gift box for \$19.00. The Lone Star design is also available as a brooch or pendant, and in a variety of earring styles starting at \$10.95.
